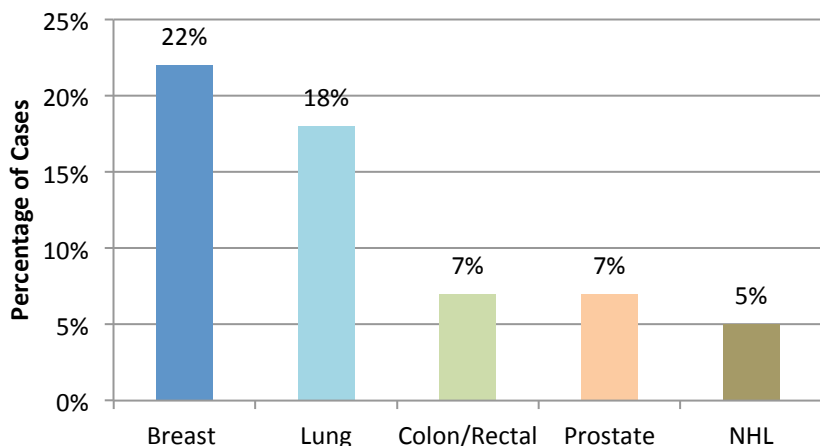

- Rideout Health (RH) had 490 analytic cases in 2015. Analytic cases are cases which are diagnosed and/or first course of treatment was performed at RH.
- Breast Cancer rates:** 61% of all breast cancers diagnosed at RH in 2015 were stage 0 or I, similar to national averages. RH 2013 incidence rates are higher when compared to the National Cancer Data Base 2013 data for invasive breast cancer. RH incidence rates for invasive female only breast cancer is higher than the Nation and the State of California expected.
- Prostate Cancer rates:** Greater than 50% percent of all RH analytic prostate cases are diagnosed at either stage I or II. Prostate incidence rates at RH are less than the expected rates for the Nation, State of California and NCDB 2013 data.
- Lung Cancer rates:** Incidence rates for lung cancer have remained high at RH, and continue to be higher than NCDB 2013, State and Nation expected. A similarity between stage at diagnosis is noted when comparing NCDB 2013 with RH 2013 lung cancer data. According to NCDB 2013, 32 % of lung cancers were diagnosed at stage I or II and 37 % were diagnosed at the same stage at RH. However, both NCDB 2013 data and RH have 44% of the cases diagnosed at stage IV.
- Colo/Rectal Cancer rates:** RH has had a decrease of incidence over the last few years. Incidence rates at RH are comparable with NCDB 2013 data, State and Nation expected.
- NHL:** Incident rates have stayed relatively stable over the years at RH, and are similar to the expected rates of the State, Nation and NCDB data.
